How to Add a QR Code to a Classroom Handout

1

Pick the resource you want students to access

A YouTube video walkthrough, a Google Doc reading, a Google Form quiz, a Drive folder of practice problems, a Padlet board — anything with a URL.

2

Generate a dynamic QR code in EZQR

Paste the URL. A dynamic code lets you swap the linked resource between semesters — same printed handout, new video or updated reading list, no reprinting.

3

Drop the QR onto the handout

Place it near the top right or bottom right at around 2cm × 2cm. Add a caption: "Scan for the video walkthrough" or "Scan for the lab procedure." Make sure it has clear white space around it so cameras can lock on.

4

Test scan with both iPhone and Android

Phones in your classroom will be a mix. Scan a printed copy with both before duplicating for the whole class. If either struggles, increase the QR size or simplify the link.

5

Reuse and repoint the next term

When you teach the unit again, update the destination instead of reprinting handouts. New video, new reading, new form — same handout in students hands. Per-code analytics also show how many students actually opened the resource.
